

Personnel Spotlight

<u>Great job!</u> The Concord Monitor recently published a letter to the editor from a Bow couple thanking the Fire Department for the excellent service that they provided. This included both the technical service and the friendly and caring service that was provided.

Patrol Officer Philip Goodacre, *Police Department,* attended a week-long training and instruction program held at the NH Police Standards and Training Academy. He is now a certified Firearms Instructor and able to train officers on the art of weapon safety, use of force, and shooting techniques.

Patrol Officer Tyler Coady, *Police Department*, participated in a two-day armory training session at Sig Sauer Academy in Epping. This will allow him to service and repair the Department's handguns.
